one it is) and will also attend the Woodward Avenue Dream Cruise in Detroit which is Kevin's original stomping grounds. The story of I Love Lucy—Marty & Kevin Byrnes' '66 Impala SS convertible

Lucy's story starts before Kevin and Marty Byrnes were married. Marty owned a brand new '66 Impala convertible when she was 18 years old. Her first husband made her sell the car when they got married because it wasn't paid for. (She knew early on this marriage was not going to last!) She was determined that some day in the future she would own another '66 Impala SS Convertible. Marty purchased Lucy from a private owner in Gaylord, Michigan in 1999. Marty had just lost her beloved Golden Retriever Lucy, so the car was named in her memory. They now have documentation verifying that her engine, drivetrain, etc. are original to the rest of the car. Being a Michigan girl, 39 years of rain, snow and road salt took its toll on Lucy's body and her engine. In July 2001, Kevin and Marty drove her from Battle Creek, Michigan where Marty is originally from, to Phoenix. Well, almost to Phoenix; Lucy's engine blew in Gallup, New Mexico. The remainder

He has refurbished countless parts and accessories. The clock and the radio have also been restored. All chrome was redone by Papago Plating. It's gorgeous.
